Southwest Transitway Community Advisory Committee (CAC)

Definition

A representative group of stakeholders that meets regularly to discuss issues of common concern.

Purpose

- To promote and broaden continued community involvement in the Southwest LRT project.
- To provide guidance to the consultant team, the Southwest Technical and Policy Advisory Committees regarding community issues through the DEIS and preliminary engineering phases.

Process/Actions

The CAC will be a forum for education, discussion and community outreach. Deliberations will be consensus-based.

Reporting Relationship

The CAC will report quarterly to the Southwest Policy Advisory Committee (PAC). CAC information will be shared with the Southwest Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and the Project Management Team (PMT) as well.

Membership (25)

1 representative for each proposed station location along the LRT 1A, LRT 3A, and LRT 3C routes.

Member Role/Responsibilities

- Attend CAC meetings
- Contribute to the discussion of issues
- Listen and respect the viewpoints of others
- Participate in the development of solutions
- Accept the outcome of difficult decisions
- Provide periodic updates to their respective neighborhood association or city council
