

Investment Framework

Developed through a 14-month collaborative process with Southwest Corridor cities, the Southwest Project Office and supported by consultant expertise.

Funded through HUD-EPA-DOT Sustainable Communities Grant & Hennepin County Community Works.

Completed in 2013.



Transitional Station Area Action Plans

Intended to promote opening day readiness by bridging the gap between current conditions and future needs by addressing:

- ❖ Station platform locations
- ❖ Park and ride sites
- ❖ Future development potential
- ❖ Access and circulation planning
- ❖ Infrastructure planning
- ❖ Stormwater management options



4	Sidewalk/Trail	Along new roadways	Include sidewalks along new roadway segments	Primary
